The right of Citizens Light, Power and Water Company to use the water and adjacent land covered by this application has been acquired by location, appropriation, use and purchase as outlined and described in the following location certificates and deeds:

November 1900, -- water right location on Ketchikan Creek by John W. Stedman, deeded to Citizens Light, Power and Water Company April 20, 1903.

April 14, 1903, -- water right location on Ketchikan Creek by John W. Stedman, claiming 3,000 miners inches of water, with the necessary rights of way privileges for furnishing and maintaining a supply of water to the citizens of Ketchikan. Deeded to Citizens Light, Power and Water Company April 20, 1903.

April 23, 1903, -- dam site location at the foot of Ketchikan Lake by Ketchikan Light and Water Company for establishing a reservoir to regularly furnish water to the Ketchikan Light and Water Company. Transferred by them to Ketchikan Power Company and by the latter, deeded to Citizens Light, Power and Water Company December 21, 1903.

May, 1903, -- location of power house site, on Ketchikan Creek, by Citizens Light, Power and Water Company.

May 23, 1903, -- location of right of way for pipe lines, transmission lines, flumes and ditches by Citizens Light, Power and Water Company, running from Ketchikan Creek above the power house site previously located to and into the City of Ketchikan.

December 21, 1903, -- deed of Ketchikan Power Company to Citizens Light, Power and Water Company, transferring to the latter company all of said Ketchikan Power Company's water rights, flumes, pipe lines and electrical power transmission lines on Ketchikan Creek and within the town of Ketchikan together with all riparian rights in and adjacent to Ketchikan Creek and its tributaries and on the lakes at the head of said creek.

October 9, 1905, -- water right location on Ketchikan Creek by J. C. Barber, claiming 6,000 miners inches for the use of Citizens Light, Power and Water Company to be used by said Citizens Light, Power and Water Company for industrial, power, domestic and other purposes.

October 10, 1905, -- judgment and decree of the U. S. District Court of the District of Alaska, No. 1, comprising final order of condemnation of rights of way for flumes, dams, pipe lines, transmission lines and power house site on and across mining locations claimed by the Laskawanda Gold and Copper Company.



May 16, 1908, - water right location at the head of Ketchikan Creek and outlet of Ketchikan Lake by J. C. Barber, claiming 6,000 miners inches for the use of Citizens Light, Power and Water Company to be used for industrial, power, domestic and other purposes; also claiming the right for said company to construct a dam at the mouth of Ketchikan Lake for the purpose of storing the waters of said lake and regulating and controlling their flow.

June 5, 1911, - dam site location at the outlet of Ketchikan Lake No. 2, designated herein as Upper Ketchikan Lake, by Citizens Light, Power and Water Company for the purpose of raising, storing, controlling and using the waters of said lake.

February 28, 1912, - deed from Ketchikan Consolidated Mines Company to Citizens Light, Power and Water Company conveying the ground under and around the power house of said Citizens Light, Power and Water Company, together with certain rights of way for flumes, pipe lines, transmission lines and water pipes on and across certain mining locations claimed by said Ketchikan Consolidated Mines Company.

July 24, 1912, - water right location on branch of Ketchikan Creek, now known as Granite Basin Creek, claiming the right to use water to the amount of 2,000 cu. ft. per minute and such excess as the stream may produce, with the necessary right of way for the construction and operation of a pipe line conveying the water from said location to the power house of Citizens Light, Power and Water Company, and to use said water for power and other purposes.

May 17, 1919, - Amended location notice of trade and manufacturing site originally located by Citizens Light, Power and Water Company in 1903; the ground above located being under and around the power house of said Citizens Light, Power and Water Company.

June 11, 1920, - water right location and dam site location, by Citizens Light, Power and Water Company, covering 500 cu. ft. per minute of water and such excess amount as may be available at the outlet of Fawn Lake - about two-thirds of a mile northeast of the power house of Citizens Light, Power and Water Company of Ketchikan - for the purpose of using said water in connection with its power lines and pipe lines serving the City of Ketchikan and adjacent territory. Claiming also a right of way for necessary pipe lines to convey said water.

June 11, 1920, - water right location and dam site location of Citizens Light, Power and Water Company claiming 500 cu. ft. per minute and such an excess amount as may exist in a small stream, known as Beaver Lake stream, designated herein as Deer Creek, located about one-half mile northeast of the power house of Citizens Light, Power and Water Company, together with a right of way for the construction of the pipe lines necessary to convey said water.

December 23, 1921, - U. S. Land Office certificate to Citizens Light, Power and Water Company for that certain tract of land located under and around the power house of said company and embraced in U. S. survey No. 1261.

March 24, 1922, - grant from the United States of America to Citizens Light, Power and Water Company, that certain tract of land located at the head of Ketchikan Creek, designated as U. S. Survey No. 1262, and fully described therein.

April 18, 1924, - grant from the United States of America to Citizens Light, Power and Water Company, that certain tract of land located on Ketchikan Creek, north of the City of Ketchikan, designated as U. S. Survey No. 1261, and fully described therein.

The Citizens Light, Power and Water Company has been regularly using the waters of Ketchikan Creek and Granite Basin Creek since the construction of its power house and pipe lines in 1903.

There are no other known claimants whose rights are being infringed upon by the water rights mentioned above or by the areas and rights of way requested in this application.
